Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (AEP) is HERE October 15th - December 7th. Shelby Senior Services will again partner with Medicare and have SHIP Counselors available to assist you at NO COST.

With Covid-19 still being a community issue, contact with a SHIP counselor will continue to be adjusted. Limited face to face visits will be available. Many of the issues that arise during the AEP can be satisfactorily managed over the phone. You will be offered the option of phone or "face to face".

What to know to make your appointments run smoothly:

1. Schedule your appointment for one hour per person, arriving on time and use the entire hour.

2. Days available for SHIP appointments begin October 15 and end December 7. Hours of availability are not yet confirmed. There will be phone appointments and "as needed" face to face appointments.

2. Bring your "New" Medicare Card (the red, white, and blue card)

3. Bring a complete list of your PRESCRIPTION drugs by name, dosage, and frequency.

4. Bring all of the cards you use for any of your health care when you see your doctors.

5. Know the names of your attending physicians and what hospital you prefer, should you need to be referred from Major Hospital.

6. Know your monthly income to see if you qualify for any subsidies.

How Do I Schedule with a SHIP Counselor for Medicare AEP?

1. Call Shelby Senior Services 317-398-0127. Inform the receptionist that you want to schedule a Medicare Annual Enrollment appointment with a SHIP counselor.

2. Your call will be transferred to a volunteer or employee for scheduling.

3. You will be asked your name, phone number, and what are you wanting to review: Do you only want to review your prescription drug plan, do you want to review your medical, dental, and or Advantage Plan, or all of the above?

You will be responsible for remembering your appointment. You will not be receiving reminder calls prior to your appointment. If you need to cancel or reschedule your appointment, call Shelby Senior Services 317-398-0127 for assistance.

The paralegal will be in the office Oct. 12th. If you are a senior and needing financial advice, please call Shelby Senior Services to make an appointment.





- Weather conditions rule. Rain or wet ground will not allow unloading of products.







TITLE VI COMPLAINT PROCEDURE (GENERAL REQUIREMENT)

Any person who believes she or he has been discriminated against on the basis of race, color, or national origin by the Shelby Senior Services/*ShelbyGo* may file a complaint by completing and submitting the agency's Title VI Complaint Form. *ShelbyGo* investigates the complaint received no more than 180 days after the alleged incident. *ShelbyGo* will process complaints that are complete.

Once the complaint is received, Shelby Senior Services/*ShelbyGo* will review it to determine if our office has jurisdiction. The complainant will receive an acknowledgement letter informing her/him whether the complaint will be investigated by our office.

Shelby Senior Services/ShelbyGo has 60 days to investigate the complaint. If more information is needed to resolve the case, ShelbyGo may contact the complainant. The complainant has 10 business days from the date of the acknowledgement letter to send requested information to the investigator assigned to the case. If the investigator is not contacted by the complainant or does not receive the additional information within 10 business days, ShelbyGo can administratively close the case. A case can be administratively closed also if the complainant no longer wishes to pursue his or her case.

After the investigator reviews the complaint, she/he will issue one of two letters to the complainant: a closure letter or a letter of finding (LOF). A closure letter summarizes the allegations and states that there was not a Title VI violation and that the case will be closed. An LOF summarizes the allegations and the interviews regarding the alleged incident, and explains whether any disciplinary action, additional training of the staff member, or other action will occur. If the complainant wishes to appeal the decision, she/he has 15 days after the date of the letter or the LOF to do so.

A person may also file a complaint directly with the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) at FTA Office of Civil Rights, 1200 New Jersey Avenue SE, Washington, DC 20590.
