Annual Enrollment 2026

Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (AEP) is HERE – October 15, 2025 through December 16, 2025. Shelby Senior Services, will again this year, partner with Medicare and have SHIP Counselors available to assist you at NO COST. Both in-person and phone-call appointments will be available. Let the volunteer know your preference when you call to make your appointment.

IMPORTANT to KNOW to make your appointments run smoothly:

1. Schedule your appointment for one hour and be prepared to arrive on time and use the entire hour. One hour per person (not one hour per couple).
2. Days available for SHIP appointments begin October 15, 2025 and end December 16, 2025. Hours are Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday 10:00am-2:00pm.
3. **Bring your Medicare Card (the red, white, and blue one) and You Book you received in the mail.**
4. **Bring a complete list of your PRESCRIPTION drugs by name, dosage, and frequency.**
5. Bring all the cards you use for any of your health care when you see your doctors.
6. Know your monthly income to see if you qualify for any subsidies.
7. If you do not have the needed materials with you, you will be asked to reschedule your appointment.

How do I schedule with a SHIP Counselor for Medicare AEP?

1. Call Shelby Senior Services at 317-398-0127. Inform them that you want to schedule a Medicare Annual Enrollment appointment with a SHIP Counselor.
2. If you prefer a phone appointment, this is when you tell them.
3. You will be asked: your name, your phone number, and what you are wanting to review. Do you only want to review your prescription drug plan or do you want to review your medical, dental, and/or Advantage Plan, or all of the above?

You will be responsible for remembering your own appointment. You will not be receiving reminder calls prior to your appointment. If you need to cancel or reschedule your appointment, call Shelby Senior Services at 317-398-0127 for assistance.

Nutrition is key at every age.

Introducing Commodity Supplemental Food Program for Seniors (CSFP) – Shelby County

* FREE BOXES OF NONPERISHABLE FOOD FOR SENIORS IN NEED *

Each month, many older adults in Indiana must decide between purchasing food, filling prescriptions, or paying rent and utilities. Limited income and retirement savings do not cover all of their necessary living expenses.

Commodity Supplemental Food Program, or CSFP, eases the decision for area seniors because they know they can count on groceries to supplement their food budget.

CICOA and the Indiana State Department of Health have teamed up to provide free USDA food to help meet the nutritional needs of low-income older adults in Shelby county.

The USDA Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) provides boxes of nutritional, nonperishable food, such as canned fruits and vegetables, cold cereal, cheese and bottled juice.

Eligibility for the CSFP food boxes is based on age, income, and residency.

Pick Up will be the 4th Monday each month from 1-3 p.m. ONLY.

Lois collects angels, and her favorites are the four seasons. Jerry and Lois share a love of square dancing. They have been dancing from 1977 to 2019, and have attended many National Square Dancing conventions. Lois has been a part of the senior center family for many years. She started out as a CICOA employee when the center was at the West Washington location, then moved to the Harrison Street location, and then to the MHP Health and Wellness location. Yellowstone & Jackson Hole September 2025

Shelby Senior Services recently sponsored a trip to Yellowstone & Jackson Hole in September.

Guest traveler Sherry Ponsler took great notes about what she saw and experienced. I am paraphrasing her observations below:

Surprisingly, she observed, travelers to Yellowstone were impressed by the Fall foliage. Magnificent yellows, oranges and reds dotted the countryside. The scenery was absolutely gorgeous! In addition, animals were plentiful, including elk, bison, bald eagles, sea otters, ducks and sheep.

One of the highlights was the Mormon Tabernacle church in Salt Lake City, Utah. Fortunately, the group was treated to a practice session by an organist while visiting this beautiful structure. The sounds from the large pipe organ were unbelievable, she wrote.

Across the street from the church, a family research center will search a person's family tree free of charge. Some of the travelers found out about their ancestors as far back as nine generations. While in Utah the group also visited the beautiful state capitol building.

Of course, another highlight was Old Faithful, which erupts approximately every ninety minutes. The visitors experienced many steam vents, "chocolate" mud pots, geysers and thermal basins, she said.

The magnificent Teton mountains showcased stunning white tops of glacial ice and snow. The Grand Teton is over thirteen thousand feet above sea level. To guard against altitude sickness, travelers were encouraged to drink lots of water.

In Jackson Hole, they boarded horse-drawn covered wagons to ride to the Double H Bar ranch to attend a BBQ. Along the way, they were "held up" by riders on horseback, pretending to be robbers!

The following day, they loaded onto rafts on the Snake River and floated three hours to the downtown Jackson Hole Playhouse, where they enjoyed a performance of "Cat Ballou."

After a lengthy delay at the airport, their uneventful flight landed safely back home.
