

- Location: The Shelby County Farmers Market is located at the corner of West Washington and Harrison Streets in Shelbyville, IN. You can find it on the Shelbyville Public Square.
- Hours: The market is open on <u>Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to</u> <u>12:00 p.m.</u> during the season, which runs through September 27th, 2025.

Although Shelby Senior Services has sponsored trips to many places in Canada over our years of travel, Ottawa, which is the capitol of Canada, was new to me. The St. Lawrence River cruise was a highlight in Montreal, and Quebec City's Fairmont Le Chateau Frontenac (hotel)

reminded me of the splendor of European architecture.

Ottawa was named by the Algonquin Indians to mean either Traders or People of the Forest. That name emerged after the construction of the Rideau Canal by a man named Colonel By to enhance the lumber trade route. The area had been previously named Bytown.

Ottawa's Parliament Hill, the seat of government in Canada, features the grandeur you would expect as a capitol. As we passed by the Hill, the parade grounds in front of the building came to life with the red uniforms and large black bearskin hats we are accustomed to seeing in the changing of the guard in London, England. Crowds lined the perimeter to witness the event.

Streets surrounding Parliament Hill are dotted with world-wide Embassy buildings, especially the impressive American Embassy. The Canadian government represents its ten provinces and two territories.

Another highlight of the trip was the cruise on the St. Lawrence River. Just after enjoying eating and shopping in the Underground City and visiting the Saint Joseph's Oratory of Mount Royal, which is a beautiful church in downtown Montreal, we headed for the dock and boarded the ship. I especially enjoy city river cruising, because one can see so many of the city's attractions and its industrial base from the water. Montreal is a main hub of trade. Container ships handle millions of cargo a year.

The 1976 Olympics were held in Montreal along the St. Lawrence River front. The stadium was built outside the main city because the mayor was convinced that the population of 2 million people would be 13 million by the time of the Olympics. He was wrong. So the rest of the venue was scattered for several miles along the river front back to the center of the city. Many of the attractions, such as what seems to be a mile-long roller coaster, are still in use today.

Quebec City sits on two levels, the upper level and lower level. Even though I have visited Quebec City in the past, our bus tour back then only took us by the Fairmount Le Chateau Frontenac hotel on the upper level. This time, when we exited the tour bus on the lower level, I headed straight for the Funicular, which is the people mover, and rode up the steep hill to experience the hotel and shops I missed previously.

The Chateau Frontenac rivals any hotel in Europe with its stunning architecture, crystal chandiliers, marble staircases and mahogany carved moldings. Outside, the vast porches on the hotel's two sides take in the breathtaking view, as well as provide enough space for musicians, dancers and other entertainers to wow the audiences. Lining the streets on the two sides are specialty restaurants and unique shops. They are intimate places to meet the shop owners, artisans or restaurant owners.


