For food pantries this means that donations slow down. My hope for 2024 is that we can keep our pantry stocked year-round.

Our pantry currently delivers food twice per month to approximately 30 seniors. We specifically try to help those who are unable to get to the store on their own, whether it be because of a lack of transportation or a disability or illness that makes shopping difficult. Some are temporarily on the list, others need consistent help and rely upon these deliveries. We need your help to keep our shelves stocked.

I would like to present to you, the amazing Shelby County community, a challenge to help me feed the seniors who need our help. Each month I will check our inventory and post in this newsletter what items are most needed. All non-perishable food items are always welcome, but sometimes the pantry is overflowing with some items and short on others. For those who help me restock the needed item of the month I will have a drawing at the end of the month for a small prize and, with your permission, you'll be acknowledged in my next post.






