




How much do you know about dementia? What is dementia? Would you recognize the signs or would you pass the symptoms off as signs of normal aging? Let's look at what dementia is, then let's discuss the difference between some of the typical signs of aging and signs of a more serious issue.


First, the word "dementia" encompasses many diseases that affect memory and functioning. The more common diseases include Alzheimer's disease, vascular dementia, Lewy body disease, and frontotemporal dementia. Usually these begin after age 65, but can have an earlier onset. Dementia is defined by Oxford Language as "a condition characterized by progressive or persistent loss of intellectual functioning, especially with impairment of memory and abstract thinking, and often with personality change, resulting from organic disease of the brain." But what does dementia look like?

Nearly everyone starts experiencing some memory loss with age. If you are witnessing a loved one struggle, always consult with a doctor, of course. If you see any of the following signs, make sure to point them out to the doctor. The Alzheimer's Association provides a list of ten signs for early detection if you would like a more extensive description. Let's talk about a few of the more common symptoms and the difference between someone experiencing dementia and someone who is showing typical signs of aging.

- Disruptions in daily life due to memory loss. Everyone occasionally forgets a name or how to make a favorite recipe. Dementia is more disruptive the inability to remember the name of a close loved one or being unable to recall the recipe even after prompting.
- Difficulty with familiar tasks. Someone may ask for help with using an electronic device that they have used before and that can be typical. Someone with dementia may begin to struggle with tying their shoes or brushing their teeth.
- Poor judgement. Everyone falls for a scam at times or gives money to someone even when they know it will not be put to good use. A person with dementia may be easily persuaded to give away large sums of money or make choices that seem very out of character.

If you would like to know more about dementia, feel free to contact us at Shelby Senior Services. Ask about our Dementia Friends information sessions. Reach out to the Alzheimer's Association. Talk to your doctor. Please do not feel that you are alone if you or someone you love is struggling with possible dementia. There is help available from many different sources for the person with dementia and those who love them. Just reach out to get started.

TRAVEL

When you visit the East Coast of the United States, be prepared to experience history almost everywhere you go. That's what the travelers with Shelby Senior Services were excited about on our recent trip to Virginia Beach. The City of Virginia Beach wasn't officially incorporated until 1952, but it was a pivotal part of the military and cultural background of our country.

For me, the highlights of our journey were Williamsburg, the Mariners' Museum, the Naval Base and the Battleship Wisconsin.

I have visited Williamsburg several times over the years. Our children were 6 and 7 years old the first time and were excited to see the costumed people and colonial toys. They were not impressed by the historical significance of Williamsburg. So, my husband and I visited on our own and loved the colonial guides who assumed the role of a colonial person of the time period.

Now I get to take travelers there so they can appreciate what I have grown to love over the years. The town is dynamic, alive and typical of early America. It is the largest living history museum, according to the brochure. It is 300 acres! Our first visit was a walking tour of the center of town with shops to compliment the visit. Now, "there are taverns, world-class art museums, and artisans practicing historic trades." They even have a stage for live performances and educational lectures.

It was a very hot and humid day, but the fascinating tour led our travelers in and out of the air conditioned buildings. While impossible to see all of Williamsburg in just a few hours, it is worth going back to experience everything it has to offer about early colonial life.

The Mariners' Museum caters to all ages. Founded in 1930, it is both an educational museum and a historical museum. It features the story of early exploration and ship building complete with hand made models, some in miniature, as well as the battles, slave trade, and a huge, life-size model of the USS Monitor Civil Warship's outside protective iron covering. The Ironclad Revolution exhibition tells the story of the 1862 building of the USS Monitor and features a full-size replica of the revolving gun turret.

In another section of the multi-room museum called the International Small Craft Center, a life-sized model of the America's Cup AC72 catamaran, which is 72 feet long, hangs overhead so the visitor can see every inch. The "foils" situated under the model enable the hull to rise out of the water to attain speeds about three times faster than the wind. It is an awesome craft.

You can tell I really enjoyed this outstanding museum.



Situated on the coast is the largest Naval Base in the world. We boarded the Victory Rover sightseeing boat and spent two hours sailing by the base. We were close to three enormous aircraft carriers, battleships and numerous shipyards with Navy ships being repaired in port. The narrator pointed out the many facets of the base, as well as the cargo ships which were being loaded and unloaded along the way.

The USS Battleship Wisconsin has been decommissioned and we were able to walk the decks, hear about its history and live vicariously through the eyes of the guides along the way through the adjoining museum. The military of the United States is awesome and these sights made me feel secure.

Annual Enrollment 2024

Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (AEP) is HERE – October 16 through December 5. Shelby Senior Services, will again this year, partner with Medicare and have SHIP Counselors available to assist you at NO COST. Both in-person and phone-call appointments will be available. Let the receptionist know which is your preference when you call to make your appointment. IMPORTANT to KNOW to make your appointments run smoothly:

- 1. Schedule your appointment for one hour and be prepared to arrive on time and use the entire hour. One hour per person (not one hour per couple).
- 2. Days available for SHIP appointments begin October 16 and end December 5. Hours begin 12:00pm-3:00pm.
- 3. Bring your Medicare Card (the red, white, and blue one).
- 4. Bring a complete list of your PRESCRIPTION drugs by name, dosage, and frequency.
- 5. Bring all the cards you use for any of your health care when you see your doctors.
- 6. Know your monthly income to see if you qualify for any subsidies.

How do I schedule with a SHIP Counselor for Medicare AEP?

- 1. Call Shelby Senior Services at 317-398-0127. Inform them that you want to schedule a Medicare Annual Enrollment appointment with a SHIP Counselor.
- 2. If you prefer a phone appointment, this is when you tell them.
- 3. You will be asked: your name, your phone number, and what you are wanting to review. Do you only want to review your prescription drug plan or do you want to review your medical, dental, and/or Advantage Plan, or all of the above?

You will be responsible for remembering your own appointment. You will not be receiving reminder calls prior to your appointment. If you need to cancel or reschedule your appointment, call Shelby Senior Services at 317-398-0127 for assistance.

Clarification on vaccines from Medicare Bingo in September:

Vaccines offered at no-cost to Medicare beneficiaries include:

Shingles, Flu, COVID, Pneumococcal, RSV, Hepatitis B, Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis. Should you have additional questions or concerns you may contact Shelby Senior Services and ask for the SHIP counselor.


"Just a friendly reminder" as flu season is approaching, ShelbyGo Drivers may ask you to wear a mask while in their vehicle.



TITLE VI COMPLAINT PROCEDURE (GENERAL REQUIREMENT)

Any person who believes she or he has been discriminated against on the basis of race, color, or national origin by the Shelby Senior Services/ShelbyGo may file a complaint by completing and submitting the agency's Title VI Complaint Form. ShelbyGo investigates the complaint received no more than 180 days after the alleged incident. ShelbyGo will process complaints that are complete.

Once the complaint is received, Shelby Senior Services/ShelbyGo will review it to determine if our office has jurisdiction. The complainant will receive an acknowledgement letter informing her/him whether the complaint will be investigated by our office.

Shelby Senior Services/ShelbyGo has 60 days to investigate the complaint. If more information is needed to resolve the case, ShelbyGo may contact the complainant. The complainant has 10 business days from the date of the acknowledgement letter to send requested information to the investigator assigned to the case. If the investigator is not contacted by the complainant or does not receive the additional information within 10 business days, ShelbyGo can administratively close the case. A case can be administratively closed also if the complainant no longer wishes to pursue his or her case.

After the investigator reviews the complaint, she/he will issue one of two letters to the complainant: a closure letter or a letter of finding (LOF). A closure letter summarizes the allegations and states that there was not a Title VI violation and that the case will be closed. An LOF summarizes the allegations and the interviews regarding the alleged incident, and explains whether any disciplinary action, additional training of the staff member, or other action will occur. If the complainant wishes to appeal the decision, she/he has 15 days after the date of the letter or the LOF to do so.

A person may also file a complaint directly with the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) at FTA Office of Civil Rights, 1200 New Jersey Avenue SE, Washington, DC 20590.
