

Happy Halloween! As kids we loved going door-to-door to collect ALL the candy, and then going home to sort it out. As an adult, I enjoy going door-to-door, in a sense, to pass out the healthiest food that I can for our seniors who cannot get out to shop or visit a pantry for themselves. Whenever someone new comes in and sees the extent of what happens behind the scenes to get that food out of our door and to our neighbors in need, they are often shocked. So, this month I thought I would share a description of how our pantry operates.

Where does the food come from? Some comes from food drives – food that is split among several pantries in Shelby County. Most of that food comes in during the holidays and lasts for a few months. From about March through October we depend on YOU. We receive small donations from individuals, and occasional large donations from businesses in town. We currently feed almost 50 individuals twice a month. Let's break that down into the numbers for each month:

> 100 cans of soup 200 cans of tuna 400 packets of oatmeal

> 200 cans of vegetables 100 boxes of pasta 100 rolls of toilet paper

> 100 cans of fruit 100 cans of beans 50 jars of peanut butter

Visualize that for a moment. Visualize that amount of food being packed up for delivery. Visualize packing that food into cars to distribute two times every month. Visualize driving to 50 different houses throughout the county - from Morristown to Marietta. Now visualize the grateful smiles that receive this food twice a month. Now, if at all possible, visualize where you fit into this process. If you are able to donate any amount of any of the items each month, our seniors will be so grateful. If you are able to pick up the deliveries for 5 households and drop them off twice a month, our seniors will be so grateful. If you are able to donate a little cash here and there, our seniors will be so grateful.



What is approximately 450 feet long, 75 feet wide and 45 feet tall and took 100 years to build? No, not the Convention Center. It was The Ark, of course!

Shelby Senior Services recently sponsored a trip to see the life-size replica of this gigantic ship. The trip also included a visit to the Creation Museum and a sightseeing cruise on the River Queen on the Ohio River in Cincinnati. However, for me the Ark stood out as the most interesting.

Noah, his wife Emzara, his three sons and their wives lived on the Ark for one year when the rains began falling signaling the beginning of the flood. These eight people fed, watered and cleaned cages of thousands of animals everyday. The enormity of the task is overwhelming when one views first-hand the three floors it took to house the animals. How did he manage to keep all of the species alive all that time! Imagine Noah searching the internet about what foods each animal needed. Just kidding. We know that God provided that information.

Storing the provisions would have taken a tremendous amount of space. Each of the three floors, approximately 25 feet tall, is built with wooden bins stacked row upon row to the ceiling and filled with sacks full of grain or enormous clay pots filled with water. Near the center of the Ark, Noah's living quarters are featured. Even though this is a replica, it is logical that he and the family would need to be positioned for efficiency. Life-sized representations of Noah and his family are shown doing everyday chores of cooking, sewing, feeding animals, woodworking and much more. Many move their arms and heads while performing their tasks. Among other necessities, the family had to eat, so they most likely raised gardens of consumables shown throughout the living quarters.

The Creation Museum has been around for several years. I visited there when it first opened, however, many new features have been added to make the visit more interesting. Since I had seen the beautiful exhibits following the events of the Bible, I opted to take advantage of the additions. One addition is the live music stage that features wonderful gospel artists. Currently, their focus is on 40 days of live gospel entertainment with special music by successful group and individuals. I got there on day 29, so there are several days left.

Educational presentations that day offered a demonstration about live reptiles. I learned about lizards, turtles and snakes. The presenter had these reptiles available to pet after the show. No, I didn't pet them. However, it was interesting.

Finally, we got to see Cincinnati from the River Queen, one of the sightseeing paddlewheel BB Riverboats. At 7 miles per hour, we saw everything from the prototype for the Brooklyn Bridge to the Great American Ball Park, to the Daniel Carter Beard Bridge, named after the founder of the Boy Scouts of America, to the Paul Brown Stadium. All in all it was a restful and fun ride.





*Monday, October 28th at 1:00 p.m. Halloween


Dance and Karaoke with DJ Moxy Come ready to do


Halloween Party COST \$5 Come for lunch with a



Annual Enrollment 2024

Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (AEP) is HERE – October 16 through December 5. Shelby Senior Services, will again this year, partner with Medicare and have SHIP Counselors available to assist you at NO COST. Both in-person and phone-call appointments will be available. Let the receptionist know which is your preference when you call to make your appointment.

IMPORTANT to KNOW to make your appointments run smoothly:

- 1. Schedule your appointment for one hour and be prepared to arrive on time and use the entire hour. One hour per person (not one hour per couple).
- 2. Days available for SHIP appointments begin October 16 and end December 5. Hours begin 12:00pm-3:00pm.
- 3. Bring your Medicare Card (the red, white, and blue one).
- 4. Bring a complete list of your PRESCRIPTION drugs by name, dosage, and frequency.
- 5. Bring all the cards you use for any of your health care when you see your doctors.
- 6. Know your monthly income to see if you qualify for any subsidies.

How do I schedule with a SHIP Counselor for Medicare AEP?

- 1. Call Shelby Senior Services at 317-398-0127. Inform them that you want to schedule a Medicare Annual Enrollment appointment with a SHIP Counselor.
- 2. If you prefer a phone appointment, this is when you tell them.
- 3. You will be asked: your name, your phone number, and what you are wanting to review. Do you only want to review your prescription drug plan or do you want to review your medical, dental, and/or Advantage Plan, or all of the above?
